RAF Desborough Solar Park, Northamptonshire, 2015

A9 Dualling, Scottish Highlands, 2015

AB Heritage was commissioned by CH2M Hill Fairhurst JV, on behalf of Transport Scotland, to undertake archaeological investigations along the A9 between Glen Garry and Dalraddy in the Scottish Highlands. It focussed on the central section, running through the Cairngorms National Park and some of the most stunning countryside in the world

Hindlip Hall, Worcestershire, 2016

In 2016 AB Heritage designed and managed a series of investigations at the Worcestershire Police Headquarters site at Hindlip in Worcestershire. The site was known to be rich in later pre-historic and Roman period remains. By utilising geophysical survey and targeted trial trenching AB Heritage was able to show where proposed development could be sited as to avoid any sensitive archaeology.

Gipsy Castle Lane – Hay on Wye, 2015

During 2015 and 2016 AB Heritage was commissioned to investigate a site in the famous literary town of Hay on Wye. Desk based work had identified the possibility that a prehistoric enclosure may have been present on the site. A geophysical survey and a field evaluation were deployed in order to investigate this possibility. Whilst archaeology was present on the site, the AB Heritage project showed clearly that it was of post medieval and rural character.
