Key Projects**Archaeological Works at Former RAF Locking, Somerset 2022**

Archaeological works, deposit modelling and palaeoenvironmental work to investigate the age, state of preservation and archaeological potential of deeply buried peat deposits, in advance of significance new development in Weston Super Mare.

Irish Centre Tower Block, Birmingham, 2021

Archaeological and Heritage Assessment of the potential effects to the Digbeth & Deritend Conservation Area from the proposed construction of a 43-storey tower in Birmingham. This work involved close collaboration within a multi-disciplinary team of specialists and the scheme was successfully consented.

Former Heaton Works Site, Newcastle 2021

The works revealed the very substantial system of steam power that was designed to operate beneath the floor of the works. The construction of the Heaton Works was shown to have almost completely truncated earlier deposits.

Walkergate Hospital, Newcastle, 2019

Suite of Archaeological Assessment and Mitigation. Assessment of archaeological potential for the site of the former hospital of tropical disease, known to be the site of an early industrial wagonway. This was followed up by site evaluation which located the industrial remains. An excavation of a large section of the wagonway was conducted to clear Planning Conditions.
